Frank's Fishing Report

As I predicted last month, the water didn't drop in temperature. Water temperature actually went up with the warm September we had. If we get into a normal pattern this month, the water will clear and the panfish will move shallow and start to feed in anticipation of winter. Start to look shallow for panfish. Gamefish will follow their food source.

Late in the month you may have to lighten up your presentation as the fish will start to become pressure sensitive and may start to drop the bait on you.



Muskies should start to move on suckers and move to shorelines that have a quick drop off with wood or rock on the bottom.


